As San Diego based band Switchfoot came to the Sokol Auditorium on April 18th, I was hoping they would put on a great show. Everyone has heard their hits "Meant to Live", "Dare You To Move", and "Stars".

The songs that they performed on this night sounded exactly like the studio recordings, if not better. Lead singer Jon Foreman sounded on top the whole night, mixing in some changes in the pitch of the note that people are used to, and it sounded great.
