

## **Current immunization records must be on file**

**Students enrolling for the first time in OPS, also those transferring in from out-of-state require the following:**

- 3 doses Hepatitis B vaccine
- 3 doses DPT/DT vaccine
- 3 doses Polio vaccine
- 2 doses MMR vaccine
- School Physical with Eye Exam
- 1 dose of varicella (chicken pox) given on or after 12 months of age and prior to 13 years of age – if over 13 years of age, 2 doses of varicella separated by at least one month.

Written documentation including year of varicella disease from parent, guardian, or health care provider will be accepted.

### **All other students:**

3 doses DPT/DT vaccine

3 doses Polio vaccine

2 doses MMR vaccine, first dose on or after 12 months of age, and the two doses separated by at least 28 days.

**Students in the 7<sup>th</sup> / 8<sup>th</sup> grade** are required to have a physical examination on file with our school nurse to participate and practice in athletics. The physical examination is valid for one year only.



## **Omaha Public Schools Special Education Department**

The Omaha Public Schools provides comprehensive educational evaluations and services to students with disabilities. Dr. Julie Allen, Director of Special Education for the Omaha Public School District has stated, “To appropriately serve all children with disabilities, it is critical to reach those parents who believe their child may be disabled.” All children with disabilities residing in the district, including children with disabilities attending nonpublic schools, are eligible to receive special education and related services.

According to Dr. Allen, “We want to locate and identify all children with disabilities. Efforts are made to reach children who are part of homeless families, migrant families, or children who may be in the care of persons other than their legal guardians. It is important that hospitals, pediatric clinics and other agencies that deal with children refer any child suspected of having a disability. The district has a long history of providing comprehensive special education services to children.”
