<p>Students are welcomed to Oak Valley Elementary in a variety of ways. Safe Walk to School night is held the Monday before school starts where students and parents have a chance to visit their classroom and meet their teacher. Once school is in session, all new students and families meet with office staff to complete the necessary paperwork and intake process. Students start the next day, allowing the teacher to have all the materials, nametags, locker, and seating arrangement complete. Open House is held in September. Parent and students attend Open House working together to complete a scavenger hunt to ensure they see all that Oak Valley has to offer. Two Title One Parent meetings are held to provide information about curriculum, classroom expectations, homework policy and parent involvement. Incoming kindergartners are invited to attend a meet & greet event where parents meet with staff to receive important information while students visit classrooms and do a project with teachers as a way of introducing them to the learning environment. Early Childhood Application Days begin in March. Parents and potential students attend. The Early Childhood teachers meet all incoming students. Potential students are screened at the event as well.
