Burke AP Course Expectations: Please read and carefully consider the following components which are common to ALL Advanced Placement classes...

- Carefully select AP courses based on each student's willingness and academic preparedness, after reading the course description for each AP course. AP Course Descriptions can be found at: <https://apcentral.collegeboard.org/courses>
- Chosen courses are based on past performance as well as academic and extracurricular commitments. *Please understand that successful completion of each AP course may require a minimum of 6 hours of individual study time per week outside of class on a regular basis for each AP course.* Please consider time commitments from other extra-curricular activities (job, sports, music, etc.) when selecting AP courses. Students must organize time and efforts to maximize chances of successfully completing each course.
- Burke High has a student-driven Master Schedule with the number of seats in a course set by student requests the previous school year. **Most AP courses are a year-long commitment, and it is an expectation that students will remain in the course for the entire enrollment period.** Students may request schedule changes only in extreme situations that involve major changes to your personal or academic circumstances. Space in other classes is limited. Students earning an F in the first semester will meet with their AP teacher, counselor, and Assistant Principal/Academic Director Mrs. Sara Evans to determine placement for second semester.
- Students must complete the College Board digital account activation process at the start of the year to access instructional resources and exam ordering options.
- If a student drops an AP course in which they have selected to take the AP Exam, a \$40.00 fee will be charged to students for each AP course dropped after Friday, November 7th, 2025. This fee also applies to students who fail to take the test on the appointed date and time.
- Students must follow each course syllabus (e.g., participation, grading, and make-up policies). This includes maintaining academic integrity on all assignments and assessments, maintaining communication with the AP teacher regarding personal, academic, and time management concerns and achievements, and treating the course as one would a college course for which one is earning credit towards a post-secondary degree.
- We strongly believe that daily attendance is critical to academic success. Good attendance prepares students to excel in college, career, and life. AP Students should prepare to contribute to a positive classroom culture by engaging daily, so that they are confident and prepared for a cumulative end of course exam.
- Students need approval from the Assistant Principal-Academic Director, Mrs. Sara Evans, to take four or more AP courses.
