- · Gifts and a food voucher are available to seniors (60+ years of age)
- · Food vouchers are available for families with children 16 years of age and older
- · Food vouchers are available for adults without children

Sign Up: December 1-21 Tuesdays—Saturdays

Community members can sign up their children aged 0-12 years old to receive new toys for Christmas. This should be done during your one a month shopping time. Please note that each child can only be signed up ONCE for this program:

Please bring: Your ID, a current piece of mail, Social Security cards for each child (ages 0-12) that you want to sign up to receive gifts, and a document verifying the children's ages (ex: birth certificate or Medicaid card)

Shop for Toys: December 17-21 10:00 a.m.—6:00 p.m.

You will receive a confirmation sheet during sign up with an appointment day and time to come and shop. Bring that sheet to shop for toys. Children CANNOT be present during toy shopping.

The wait time at out Outreach Centers may be longer due to our Holiday Assistance Programs, especially in the mornings. Please try visiting in the afternoon.
