This year, Dundee is continuing to implement a district initiative called MTSS-B. This is a multi-tier system of support for behavior. MTSS-B encourages adults to use positive interactions to help promote appropriate behaviors. Students are taught how to manage their behavior by clear and student-friendly expectations. Students learn and review expectations for every part of our school such as the classroom, hallway, stairway, restroom, cafeteria, and playground. Each area of the building has a poster displayed with the expectations for that area so students and staff can easily refer to it and expectations are explicitly taught, practiced, and reviewed throughout the year. **We refer to four main expectations that students know well: Be Respectful, Be Responsible, Be Safe, and Be Kind.**



To reinforce positive behavior, teachers pass out Dundee Pride Tickets. These tickets let the individual student know that he or she was following the expectations as taught and also gives other students the opportunity to know what behaviors are expected and how to receive positive reinforcement.

Students get to earn rewards individually and as a class for their pride tickets. Students also have the opportunity to enter bi-weekly raffles for special activities with Dundee teachers. Be sure to ask your child what they can earn in their classroom with their pride tickets and if they have been drawn for an activity already this year!

Below is a way for you to get involved with our Pride Ticket system at home. We have been working on specific focus skills every two to three weeks here at school. The teachers introduce the skill on Monday and then the students practice for the next two weeks. Staff members give pride tickets to students they see using the skill.

We would love to have your involvement at home as well. If you see your child using one of the skills below, write them out a pride ticket using one of the tickets on the next page. You can also write the reason your child earned the ticket on the back. Your child can bring these tickets back to school to turn into their teacher. Please take time to ask your child what he/she has earned pride tickets for at school so far! If you need a paper copy of the pride tickets, let us know and we will send one home with your student.

Below are the focus skills that we have been working on so far. Be sure to ask your child what they have learned about each skill and how they use it at school and how they can use it at home. Thank you for supporting your children and reinforcing school expectations at home!
