

Hello Dundee Families,

We are officially done with the first quarter of the school year! I thrilled to know that as a comprehensive school counseling program we have been able to cover multiple lesson themes throughout the school including: Self-Concept, Learning Skills (goal setting), Focus Skills, Growth Mindset, Feelings and Emotions, as well as Red Ribbon Week concepts (being drug and bully free).

Please remind your students that I am available for any solution-focused brief counseling sessions to address their social and emotional needs throughout the school day. They can access me by filling out a counselor request form (in my office or their teachers have copies).

NOTE: One Meal Bag per household. Stay in your vehicle and a volunteer will come to your car to check people in and deliver the bag. Recipient MUST be present, no proxies. First come first serve, so it is recommended to arrive early.

THANKSGIVING FOOD

AGENCY: Heartland Hope Mission

DATES: Clients can register at the end of September and October during normal pantry hours:

Tuesdays, 6:30 pm - 7:30 pm, Thursdays, 1:30 pm-4 pm, Saturdays, 9:30 am-12 noon

NOTE: 2022 Pre-registration is REQUIRED.
Registration begins the week of September 26th, and continues through October 29th.
Pre-registration will take place during the normal pantry hours and there will be NO link online. The client must bring a form of ID for each person permanently in the household.
Each household will be able to select a holiday meat based off their household size.

NOTE: Anyone that is residing at the same address will qualify as ONE household. If it is found that clients are registering more than once, they will be removed and not able to receive a Thanksgiving pantry. Once a holiday meat is selected, they will NOT be able to change it when they pick it up.

TURKEYFEST

AGENCY: Salvation Army Western Division Headquarters

The Salvation Army Western Division Headquarters offers a free meal delivered to older adults, 60 years of age or older (homebound, lonely, or alone) on Thanksgiving Day. Meal consists of turkey, stuffing, potatoes, gravy, green beans, roll, banana, and cookies.

NOTE: 2022 reservations accepted November 3-17. Must speak with someone to make a reservation; no voice messages will be accepted.

Applicant must be home to receive the meal, no meals will be left at the door. Volunteers prepare and deliver the meals following local regulations and CDC guidelines. Specific delivery times cannot be scheduled. Cannot feed families.

TOYLAND AND ADOPT A FAMILY

ADOPT-A-FAMILY or ADOPT-A-SENIOR pairs eligible older adults and families in need with a sponsor who purchases gifts for all participants, a well as a grocery store gift card. A pick up date, time, and location is arranged between the sponsor and recipient.

PROJECT SANTA (TOY AND JOY SHOP)

AGENCY: Open Door Mission

Empowers low-income parents to have gifts for their children (ages 0-12) under the tree on Christmas morning from themselves or Santa. Provides 3-5 toys for each child, books, diapers, coloring books and a Holiday food box. This program serves children ages birth to 12.

DATES: 2022 Registration will be during shopping hours December Tue-Sat 9 am-1 pm at Timberlake Outreach Center.

To register, an adult must bring birth certificate, or document verifying their age and social security number, a photo id and a copy of a current piece of mail (if there are changes to the household). Only one adult per household will need to be present. Children can NOT be present at registration. A child can only be registered once for this program.
