The 2nd through 6th graders went on a neighborhood walk to place letters in neighbors' doors inviting them to support Dundee. This event was complete with popsicles for everyone!

Hello Dundee Families,

I hope that the start to Fall has been wonderful to you all. I am enjoying my morning door duty, taking in the crisp morning air, and end of day bus duty, where I am still able to hold on to some of the warmth from the Summer.

This past month in our guidance classes, we have spent a lot of time working on the skill of "**FOCUS**". Hopefully, some of your students have come home and challenged you to some games that require a lot of focus, even though we deal with distractions beyond our control. We have also been discussing persistence, the power of the word "**YET**", and the differences between making poor choices versus making mistakes. I absolutely love being a

part of your students' classes. Please continue asking them about the skills we work on together and ask them to show you the app that we use for Guidance, which can be found in Clever on their iPad!

Did you know that October is National Bullying Prevention Awareness month? We also will have the opportunity, in October, to celebrate Red Ribbon Week, which is a campaign to serve as a catalyst to mobilize communities, educate youth and encourage participation in drug and bullying prevention activities. More information will be coming your way on how Red Ribbon Week will be celebrated once our Student Council members are chosen in their 4th 5th and 6th grade classes. These students will be the ambassadors for events that take place during Dundee Elementary's Red Ribbon Week.

Please continue reaching out should there ever be a need for your student(s) to see me for a Solution Focused Brief Counseling session relating to academic, personal or social issues. School counseling is not therapy, but a support for a problem that may be affecting their achievement in school. Meet Dundee's Postive Aaction Center (PAC) Facilitator!

My name is Shannon Taylor and your student knows me as Ms. Taylor. I am the new Positive Action Center (PAC) Facilitator at Dundee Elementary. It has been such a great start to the new year and I feel so honored to get to be here with your students. I have been able to go into most of the classrooms and reintroduce myself from my short start last Spring and I also wanted to take some time to give all of you a little insight into what my role at Dundee looks like.

Myself and my office are a safe space for students to go to anytime they are feeling some of the added pressures that life may throw at them. I explain to them that there are some days we experience really big emotions and we don't always know what to do with them. If they are feeling particularly sad, angry, or

they just don't know what emotion they are feeling but they are either distracted by these feelings or just need to step away from the classroom for a 10-15 minute break, they are welcome to utilize the PAC pass that each of their teachers have to come see me. We can talk about what's going on, they are welcome to just have a safe space to calm their body and mind by practicing some breathing techniques, or they can utilize some sensory items in my office.

I am available for the students that might also need some extra assistance with focusing in class, organizing, getting along with peers, etc. and will be meeting with some students one on one or in groups to work on enhancing some social and emotional skills. The concept of the positive action center is that it is indeed a positive experience. I believe when some children appear to be "attention" seeking, they are actually "connection" seeking and I want to enable them in finding that positive connection to be the best version of themselves so they can be successful in school and in everyday life.
