Device (iPad) Protection Plan

If you plan to participate in this plan, the \$20 per device fee is due September 8, 2023. We can take cash, credit card, or check (made out to Douglas County School District 001). The Device (iPad) Protection Plan will not apply until the \$20 is received.



Breakfast Program

Dundee provides a free, nutritious breakfast each morning to any student who would like one. All students enter the building at 8:30 a.m. Those participating in the breakfast program should check in with their teacher and immediately come to the cafeteria to pick up their breakfast. Thank you for timing your drop off accordingly. There is not adequate supervision before 8:30 a.m.



After School Activities

We understand emergencies during the day can happen, however, we receive many calls, at the last minute, regarding changes for a student. As you can imagine, the end of the day is very busy, and it can be difficult to get all those messages delivered by dismissal. Please discuss after school procedures with your child each morning. If an emergency occurs and you need to leave a message for your child, please call the school before 3:15 p.m.

Looking Ahead

September is National Preparedness Month. At Dundee, we are committed to providing a safe environment for students, staff, and visitors. In order to prepare staff and students for possible emergencies, we will be practicing all of our emergency drills this month. Planned drills include:

Secure Drill - Wednesday, September 6

Takes place when an external threat is identified. All staff/students return to the building if outside and remain inside. Outside doors are locked. No entry into or exit from the school will be allowed until an "all clear" announcement is made.

Lockdown Drill - Wednesday, September 13

Takes place if an internal threat is identified at the school. All school doors are locked, and students are confined to classrooms. No entry into or exit from the school will be allowed until an "all clear" announcement is made.

Severe Weather/Shelter Drill - Wednesday, September 20

Students take refuge in designated areas to protect themselves from severe weather or other hazards.

Fire Drill - Wednesday, September 27

The building is quickly evacuated when the fire alarm sounds.

Hold Drill - Wednesday, October 4

Students clear the hallway and remain in their classroom. This could occur if a child got sick in the hallway, or another minor incident.

Evacuation Drill - Wednesday, October 11

In the event of certain building emergencies, students will be relocated to an evacuation assembly area.

Our evacuation site is A.V. Sorenson Community Center

Our alternate site, if A.V. Sorenson is closed, is Brownell Talbot

You can help us by ensuring that your child's emergency contact information is accurate and current. Please contact us if your cell phone, house phone, or work phone numbers change. If you have any questions, please don't hesitate to give us a call.

Student Cell Phone Use

It is the expectation of the Omaha Public Schools, that students in elementary grades shall leave their cell phone powered off and in their backpacks during school hours. "School hours" means the time a student enters the school bus or school property until the end of the school day when they leave the school property or get off the school bus.

Staff will be discussing this policy with students. We will be letting them know that if their phone is out during school hours, it will be kept overnight and returned to them the next day. No exceptions. If the problem continues, the phone will be kept until a parent can come to the office and pick it up. IF you need to get a hold of your child, please call the front office. We really appreciate your help in this matter.



Join us in the Dundee Elementary School library. Meet other parents, hear from Principal Kaye Kennedy, and learn about what the PTO has in store this year.




Free childcare is provided in the lunchroom during each meeting.

Counselor's Corner

Hello and WELCOME BACK!

It has been wonderful seeing all of the smiling faces back in the hallways, playgrounds and sidewalks of Dundee. I am Jenny Storm, your students' School Counselor. As Dundee's counselor, my job is to provide each class with weekly lessons to provide Social and Emotional guidance, individual sessions using the Solution Focused Brief Counseling methodology, provide small group sessions for students, as well as serve the staff as a support.



The first few weeks of school have been full of hugs, rekindling friendships and learning procedures. I have been so lucky to be a part of these moments with your children and I encourage you to ask your students about these important moments.

In Counseling class, with primary students, I will be discussing what the counselor does, teaching about feelings and how to stay in control of our feelings while understanding the "Zones of Regulation". With the Intermediate grades, we will be talking about confidentiality, growth mindset, and resilience.

Should there be a need in your family for resources such as weekend food bags (provided by the Foodbank for the Heartland) or Hygiene kits (provided by United Way Shine Bright program), please reach out to me via email and I will be sure to send these items home with either you or your student.

Should your 2nd through 6th grade student have a request to meet with me, I have provided each classroom with a QR code that will lead students to an online form that they would need to fill out. K-1st can ask their teacher or a parent can email me with the request to see me. For parent requests or concerns, please email me as this is the most reliable method for me to utilize.

Please do not rely on email for emergent needs. Please use Safe2Help Nebraska: 833-980-7233 where trained counselors will be available 24/7 to help with depression, anxiety, suicidal thoughts, alcohol/drug abuse, bullying, relationship issues, violence or to report a concern.

Thank you for letting me be an important part of your students' experience at Dundee. I look forward to getting to know each and every student throughout our school year together!


