Friendly Reminder to ALL NW Students – Students MUST park in the west parking lot with a permit

Attention drivers! If you are driving to and from school and still do not have a parking permit, please see Ann in the treasurer's office located under the spiral staircase. You must have your parent/guardian sign the application, bring it in with a copy of your registration, and driver's license. Permits are \$20.

Dismissal Information All students, not in an activity or sport, must exit the building by 3:15 PM. Once you leave, you will not be allowed reentry. **We will consider extreme weather changes.**

Drop Off – Parents/Guardians must drop students off in the west parking lot. This is the side where the football stadium is located. The east lot is reserved for buses and staff parking.

Pick Up – Parents/Guardians must pick up students in the west parking lot. West parking lot traffic will go north only. The east lot is reserved for buses only, and traffic will go south.

Activity Late Bus has started. Use the QR Code found in the cafeteria and main office.

You must use your own iPad/device to sign up.

Only students who qualify for transportation will receive a late bus.

You must sign up by 2:00 PM each day. *If no one signs up, the bus will be cancelled.*

Late buses do not leave until 5:15 PM.

If you finish your activity earlier than 5:00 PM, please, call for a ride.

If you do not attend your selected activity and/or wander around the halls unsupervised, you will lose late bus privileges.
