Weighting Assignments (Using a Multiplier)-When entering grades in the grade book, teachers may assign greater weight to some assignments. For example, the final exam may impact a student's summative grade more than a unit test. Teachers will have the option use the multiplier to weight both formative and summative assessments to a maximum of 4. If a weight of 2 or more is applied to an assessment, this information will be communicated to students at the time the assessment is announced.
